- Advances current knowledge in American Indian Studies
- Includes themes that resonate with the life's work and advocacy of Vine Deloria, Jr.
- Demonstrates strong research methods, writing and scholarly inquiry

Paper Guidelines:

- Papers must not exceed 25 pages. Tables, figures, appendices and supporting materials are included in the page count. Abstracts and cover sheet are not included in the page count.
- Paper must be a double-spaced document in Word with 12 pt. font and one inch margins.
- A previously presented or published thesis or dissertation is ineligible.
- Formatting may be APA, MLA, Chicago or a style consistent with the student's discipline.
- The author may be a graduate or undergraduate student currently enrolled in any major. Graduate and undergraduate papers will be evaluated separately.
